L'EHESP organise ses troisièmes journées européennes à Amsterdam à la veille de la troisième conférence européenne de santé publique, organisée conjointement par l'Association des Ecoles de Santé Publique de la Région Européenne (ASPHER) et l'Association Européenne de Santé Publique. Cette journée a pour objectif de rassembler des professionnels de santé, décideurs et associations d'usagers qui en Europe ont recours aux formations proposées par les écoles de santé publique et adossées sur les recherches qui y sont développées. Elles ouvriront le débat sur l'espérance de vie sans handicap, les moyens de mesurer et comparer l'état de santé des populations entre les différents pays, les besoins de formation et de recherche dans ces domaines. Comment les pays européens s'organisent-ils pour aider leurs citoyens les plus vulnérables à ne pas basculer dans la trappe que représente l'association du handicap de santé et du handicap social ?

EHESP school of public health organises its third European meeting in Amsterdam, during the third European Public Health Conference, organized jointly by the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region (ASPHER), and the European Public Health Association (EUPHA). EHESP meeting will gather health professionals, deciders, and citizens organizations which often require competencies based on research outcomes obtained from schools of public health. This one-day meeting will open discussions on life expectancy without disability, how to measure, assess and compare health status among populations, needs for training and research in these domains. How European countries organize themselves to help the most vulnerable of their citizens to avoid them to be trapped into the social and medical disability?
