

Minutes Annual meeting HSR Section of EUPHA

Glasgow, November 2014

1 Welcome

The meeting starts with a welcome and opening of the meeting by Judith de Jong.

2 Update

Judith gives an update showing that the section on HSR now has more than 1600 members. More that 100 abstracts on HSR were submitted: 63 with HSR as a first choice and 56 with HSR as a second choice. This resulted in a track on HSR during the conference. Judith announces that the new incoming president elect is Natasha Azzopardi Muscat. She was also involved in EUPHA as the president of the section on Public Health Policy and Practice.

3 Activities section since November 2013

Since our last annual section meeting (November 2013, Brussels), we have undertaken the following activities:

- Newsletters have been sent out to the members of the EUPHA section;
- A first Spring Meeting was organised at NIVEL, in May 2014

At the EPH conference in Glasgow the HSR related activities were:

- The Section HSR (co-)organized two preconferences: "Building sustainable and resilient health systems" and "Patient participation and involvement in health care"
- The Section HSR (co-)organized workshops on "Patient choices in health care in the context of the health care system" and "Integrated care: a roadmap for Europe to innovate patient centred chronic disease care" (in collaboration with the section on Chronic diseases)

About the workshops:

Both were very well attended and included lively discussions with the audience.

Short wrap up both preconferences:

Jany Rademakers, co-organisor of the preconference "Patient choices in health care in the context of the health care system", shortly explained the contents of the meeting. It focused on 3 topics and involved 35 participants, of whom 20 provided a presentation. It was also decided to organise a biannual meeting in order to get the patient perspective in. The 2016 meeting will focus on health care for vulnerable groups.

Johan Hansen, co-organiser of the preconference on 'Building sustainable and resilient health systems' also provided a wrap-up. This preconference was organised together with HSR Europe and with the support of the European Health Management Association (EHMA) and the European Observatory. The preconference was dedicated to identifying building

blocks for a joint research programme between national funding bodies in the area of health services and systems research (a so-called ERA-NET in Horizon 2020). 3 Initiative on an ERA-NET

The preconference on sustainable and resilient health systems was an important stepping stone for establishing a ERANET in Horizon 2020 on health services and systems research. The lessons learned from the preconference will be used in the next year. Lead research funding institutes are both the Istituto Superiore di Santità in Italy in collaboration with ZonMw in the Netherlands. It focuses on two meta-questions 1) under what conditions can health care innovations be effectively transferred to other countries and 2) how can this enhance health systems performance? In terms of substantive topic areas, ERA-NET will focus on the organisation of services throughout the entire chain of care, ranging from public health and prevention to hospital and long-term care. Research Pillar

- Strengthening the linkage between research, training, policy and practice, by collaboration between the four pillar leads
- Strengthening EUPHA's position within Horizon 2020.
